

LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

All exhibitors in the Market Livestock areas will be required to sign the Livestock Drug-Free Statement indicating that their animal is safe for market processing and human consumption.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. All Required vaccinations should be updated. Bring all proper paper work to check in. Have proper identification for all animals.
2. Check in – All livestock or birds will be examined by knowledgeable personnel, approved by the fairboard, before entering any barns or tents, including the children's barnyard.
3. Animal Husbandry Cleanliness – All animals and their barns will be cleaned daily and maintained in a clean and healthy manner. Adequate ventilation will be provided along with clean water. All animals or pens will have their own feed and water container.
4. Any medication that needs to be administered to any market animal is to only be done by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Exhibitors will be responsible for care and expenses of animal(s) until the animal(s) leaves the fairgrounds.
